It says that when we seek the Lord, that he will hear us and that he will answer us, but not only that, that he will show us unsearchable things, hidden things, unthinkable things at times.

[1 : 21] And it's this amazing promise that when we seek the presence of the Lord, that oftentimes things will happen that only God can show us. And so wherever you're viewing this video today, whether you're in your car or whether you're gathered around the living room with your family, I just want to encourage you to lean in, to depress in to what God may have for you this morning as we prepare for worship.

the weight That these people are feeling As they so much want to come through They want to be
the hero They want to be the one That helps save lives But with that My concern is that It almost
might breed A bit of an obsession for them As they fight to find a cure And in the process Maybe
derail their own lives So let's pray for them That they would also seek the Lord That they would find
peace in Him That God ultimately would Provide a cure through them And then let's also pray
